## Item No. 14 Methamphetamine Crisis

### COUNCIL DECISION:

Council concurred in the recommendation of the Executive Policy Committee, as amended, and adopted the following:

- 1. That the Provincial and Federal Governments be immediately called upon to establish an intergovernmental task force with the City of Winnipeg, with a mandate to identify prevention and treatment strategies to help individuals suffering from addiction to methamphetamine.
- 2. That the Federal Government be immediately called upon to do all things necessary to bolster its efforts at international border crossings throughout Canada to prevent methamphetamine entering Canada and specifically Manitoba.
- 3. That in the event the Provincial and/or Federal Governments fail to create an intergovernmental task force on the methamphetamine crisis within the next 60 days, as of the adoption of this motion, that the City of Winnipeg shall create and lead a Crystal Meth Crisis Taskforce.
- 4. That the Proper Officers of the City be authorized to do all things necessary to implement the intent of the foregoing.

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DECISION MAKING HISTORY (continued):

EXECUTIVE POLICY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

On September 12, 2018, the Executive Policy Committee passed the following motion:

WHEREAS the increased presence of methamphetamine (meth) in our community is taking a significant toll on the health and well being of many of our citizens;

AND WHEREAS the use of meth is not confined to any specific area or demographic of Winnipeg;

AND WHEREAS recent crime statistics and police analysis point to increase in crime that is directly related to meth;

AND WHEREAS according to the Winnipeg Police Service a significant amount of the meth currently available in Winnipeg is produced internationally and imported into Manitoba;

AND WHEREAS the increased presence of meth on the streets of Winnipeg is requiring increasing amounts of time and resources from the police, paramedics and other health care professionals;

AND WHEREAS although police budgets continue to be increased annually to historic levels, arresting and/or temporarily housing individuals that are addicted to meth is not a long term solution;

AND WHEREAS the causes of meth addiction are complex, the treatments to overcome an addiction to meth are also complex, time and resource intensive and differ according to individual client needs;

AND WHEREAS the City has launched an Illicit Drug Strategy focusing on enforcement, intervention and education;

AND WHEREAS the City has taken steps to make land available for a 50-bed addiction recovery treatment facility at the site of Vimy Arena;

AND WHEREAS there is currently a motion before the Standing Committee on Protection Community Services and Parks to establish a "Crystal Meth Crisis Task Force" at the civic level that endeavors to examine the causes and options to treat and prevent the use of meth in our community;

AND WHEREAS it is necessary that governments at all levels commit to work together to address the root cause of meth addiction in our community and develop comprehensive prevention and treatment to help people suffering from an addiction to meth;

AND WHEREAS it is appropriate that the current Council call upon our federal and provincial governments to immediately work together with the City of Winnipeg to address the current meth crisis in our City.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Council immediately call on the provincial and federal governments to establish an intergovernmental task force with the City of Winnipeg, with a mandate to identify prevention and treatment strategies to help individuals suffering from addiction to methamphetamine.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT: Council immediately call upon the federal government to do all things necessary to bolster its efforts at international border crossings throughout Canada to prevent methamphetamine entering Canada and specifically Manitoba. and submitted the matter to Council.
