Keeyask Pandemic Actions Implemented

(Older items on this list have been removed to make room for newer information, HOWEVER, those older procedures and protocols are still in effect.)

- ✓ Encourage visits to Medical Services when experiencing symptoms of an illness
- ✓ Addition of second Nurse Practitioner the nurse practitioners are available 24 hrs a day
- ✓ On site test samples by Nurse Practitioner only individuals that have been screened by the Nurse Practitioner will be tested when required
- √ Two people per pickup truck w/crew cab; buses to/from the work site workers to sit in every other seat, one person per seat
- ✓ Physical distancing mandated in the commissary to three customers at a time
- ✓ Closure of the Entertainment Center facilities
- ✓ Wellness Center re-opened, with restrictions, on Saturday April 11, 2020
- ✓ Dining Room re-opened for service, with seating restrictions, on Tuesday April 14, 2020

Potential Future Measures

o Re-opening the Lounge, if resources allow, now that the restriction has been removed.

New Information

As stated in yesterday's Daily Brief, we are looking at bringing approximately ten cooks to site since a number of them have already left - and several more are likely to leave. If we do not replace them, we will be forced to reduce our manpower levels or possibly shut down the site. Faced with this situation, we have chosen to bring on these additional cooks (sometime around the end of the week), allowing us to continue to build Keeyask.

We understand that this may create significant concern among the workforce.

To address this concern several procedures have been put into place:

These individuals will be screened by the Nurse Practitioner prior to traveling to site, as well as upon arrival at site, to ensure they are symptom free. These individuals will also be required to adhere to a daily protocol (similar to that set for Health Care workers) prior to the start of each shift, for the first 14 days of their rotation.

The Northern Regional Health – Public Health Officer has approved of and endorsed this.


Circular Saws

The circular saw is one of the most widely used portable power tools on construction sites. If not used correctly, it can cause serious injuries. Kickback is the most common problem. It can happen to even the most careful users. You can minimize the chance of kickback by properly setting the blade depth, maintaining a sharp blade, standing in the right position, and ensuring that the material is held securely.

Always wear the proper clothing and gear when operating the saw. Read all the safety materials included in the manufacturer's instructions before using your saw. Be sure to unplug the saw when changing blades, cleaning the saw, or adjusting. Ensure the extension cord does not run across walkways where it can be a tripping hazard or get damaged. Ensure that the extension cord is in good condition, and that the plug has a ground pin. The blade should extend only 1/8 inch below the piece of material that you are cutting. Do not overextend your body when cutting. Never use your knee or foot to support the material you're cutting.

Never wedge, wire, or jam the guard to prevent it from working. This is a dangerous practice that could cause serious injury. Never fasten the trigger's safety lock in the "on" position.


The purpose of this feature is to minimize accidental starts. Always use the proper blade for the type of material and the type of cut. Never install a blade backwards to cut material; **Get the proper** blade. Before setting the saw down, make sure the guard is in place. If you don't, the saw could run across your hand or foot.
