Dear Chief Justice,

I write to you today in your capacity as the Chair of the Canadian Judicial Council.

An article published today in the Globe and Mail suggests that there has been systemic, partisan interference in the vetting process for judicial appointments. While we have been aware of the Liberal Party's supporter database being used to critique appointments, this latest news goes far beyond that.

In emails obtained by The Globe and Mail they found significant partisan interference in the selection of judges. One example cited is a judge on the Manitoba Court of Queen's Bench, Colleen Suche, being involved in the selection of candidates for the bench. Ms. Suche's husband is a former cabinet minister and Member of Parliament, Jim Carr.

The fact a sitting judge is telling political staff in the Minister of Justice's office who should be appointed and where is extremely inappropriate. This situation appears to be another example of Liberal insiders putting pressure on then Minister Jody Wilson-Raybould to achieve a result they wanted.

Clearly a wide network of Liberal Party insiders are involved in the appointment of judges across Canada. This raises serious questions about whether or not the best candidates are indeed being appointed, or if it is only those whose Liberal connections pass a test.

The mandate of the Council is "to promote efficiency and uniformity, and to improve the quality of judicial service, in superior courts." This certainly includes issues of judicial independence. I would

Further, keeping Canadians apprised of this situation will strengthen their confidence in the independence of our judicial system.
