A Message from the Chief

I am proud to share with you the 2025 Winnipeg Police Service Annual Statistical Report. This report provides an opportunity to reflect not only on the numbers themselves, but on the people, partnerships, and shared efforts behind them.

Over the past year, calls for service remained high, averaging more than 2,000 calls per day. This number underscores the continued pressures facing frontline officers, public safety communicators, and partner agencies. Despite those demands, 2025 saw meaningful progress in several key areas, including reductions in violent crime, homicides, firearm-related offences, youth crime, break and enters, and motor vehicle thefts. This marks the second consecutive year violent crime and crime severity have declined in Winnipeg.

These outcomes are not the result of any one strategy, unit, or initiative. They reflect the professionalism and dedication of our sworn members and professional staff, alongside the continued collaboration of community organizations and residents who all play a role in strengthening community safety.

At the same time, this report reminds us that important challenges remain. Calls for service continue to place significant demands on frontline responders and support personnel, while broader social pressures continue to impact communities across our city and country.

Policing continues to evolve, and so do we. The Winnipeg Police Service remains committed to being increasingly collaborative, data-informed, community-centred, and focused not only on enforcement, but also on prevention, intervention, and long-term community wellbeing. At the same time, we continue to improve frontline efficiency, strengthen accountability, and modernize service delivery to better support both our members and the communities we serve.

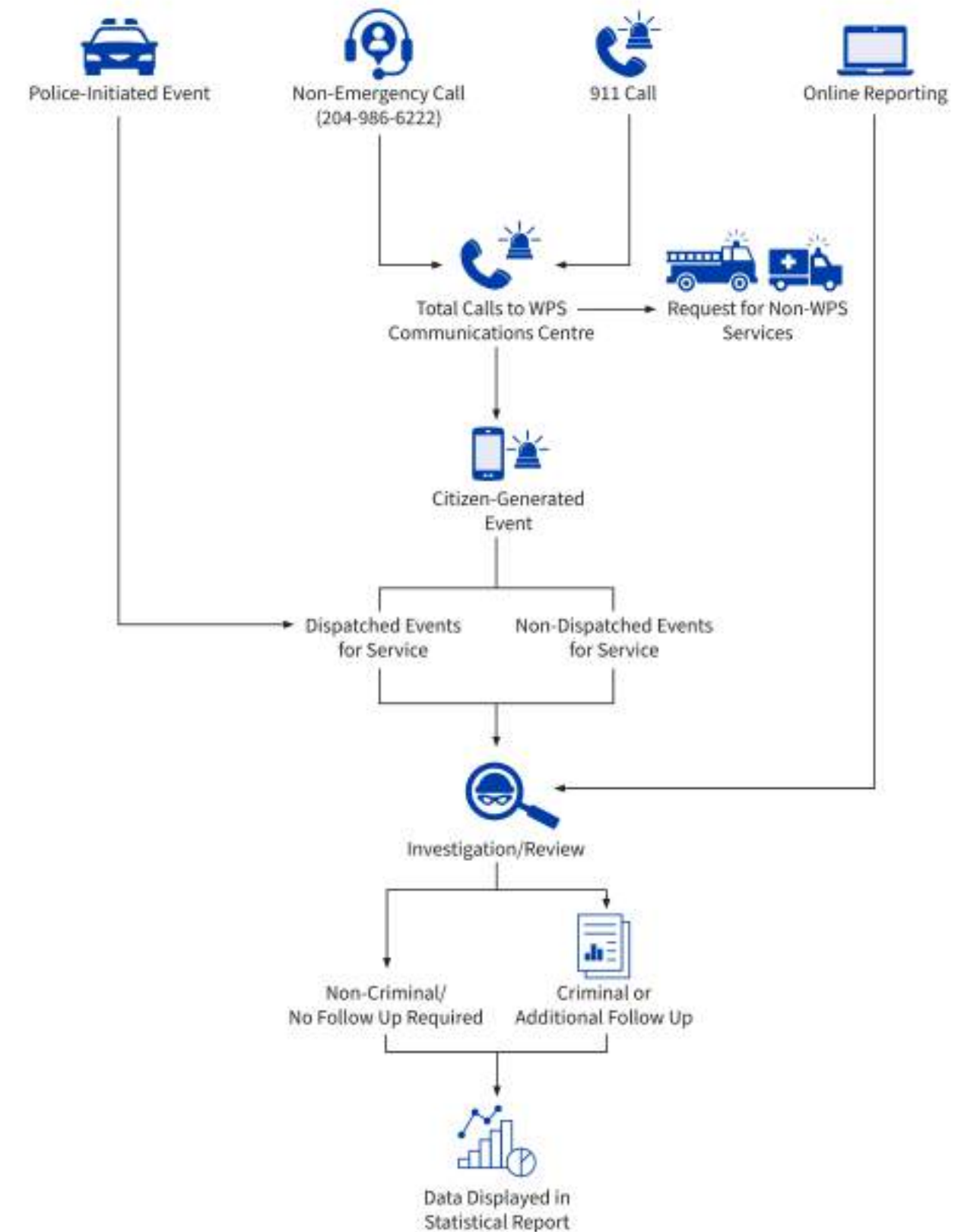

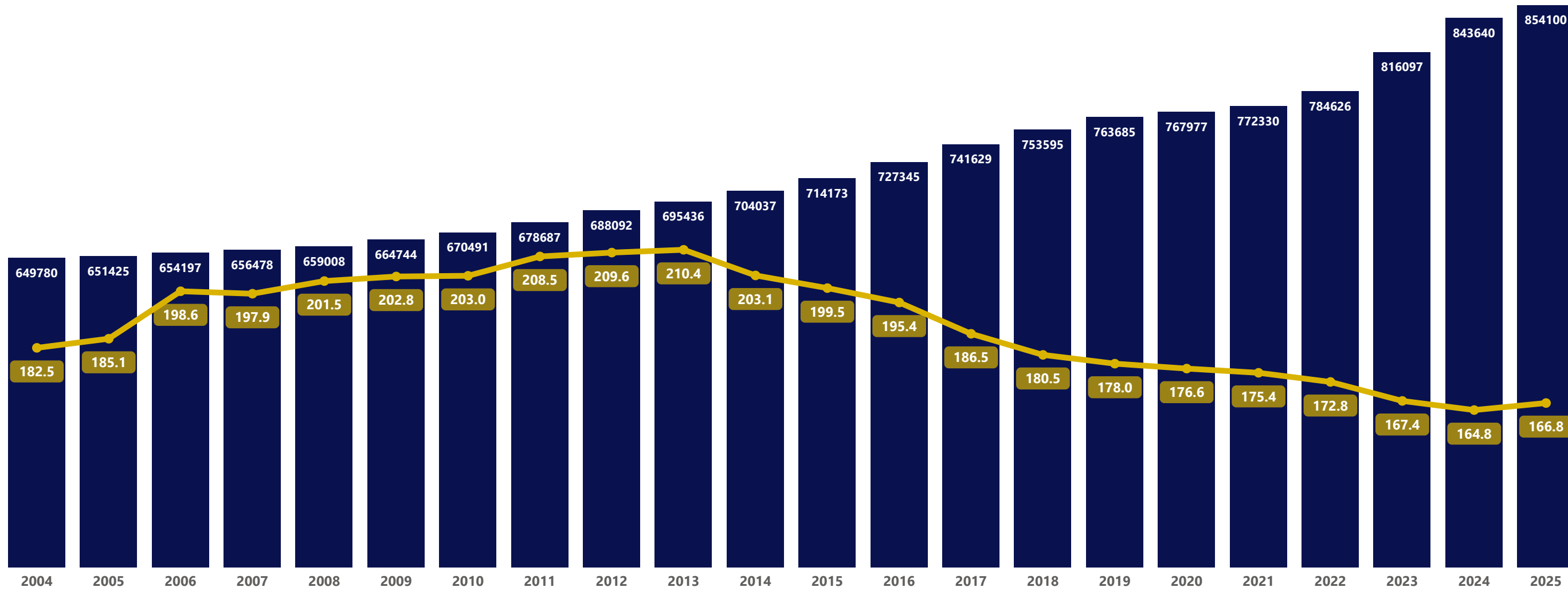

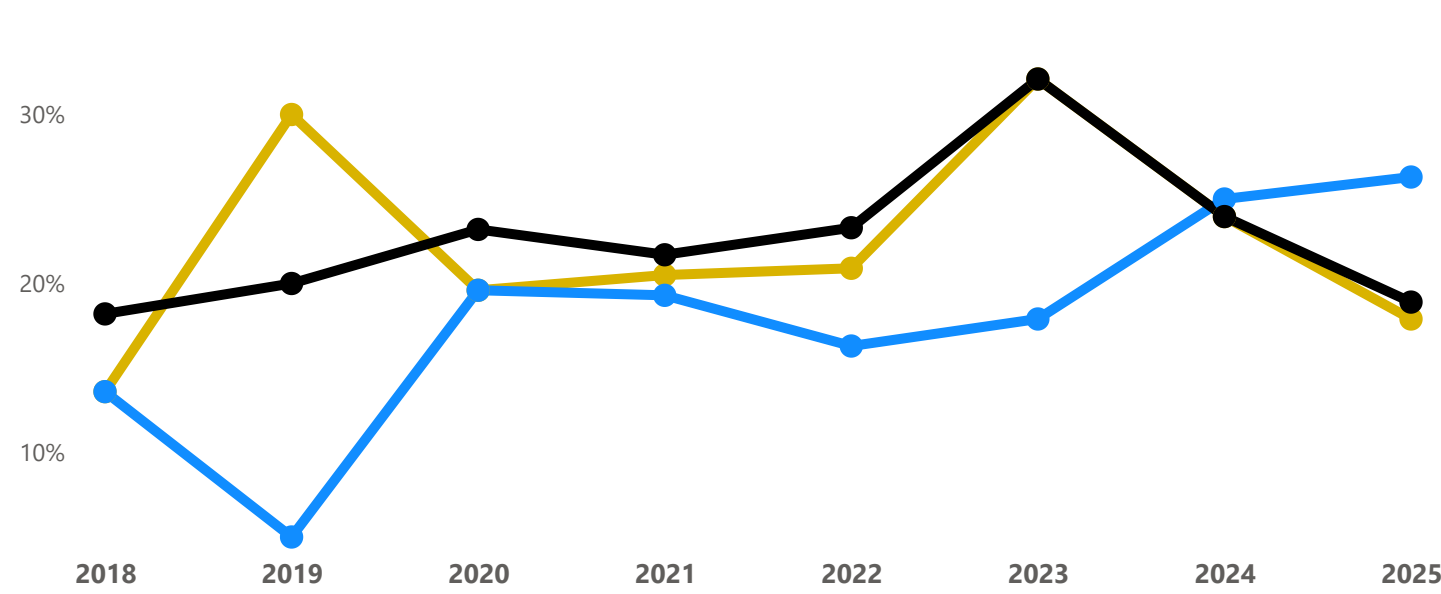

● Winnipeg Population ● WPS Authorized Officers / 100 000 Population



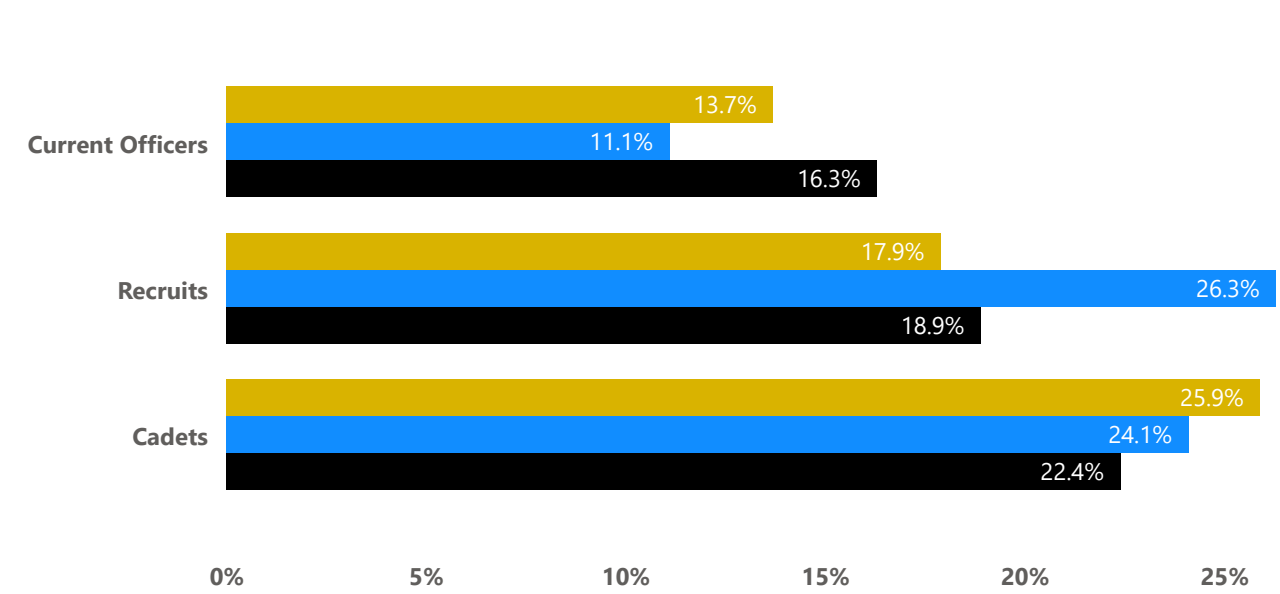
Police Recruit Demographics: 2018 - 2025

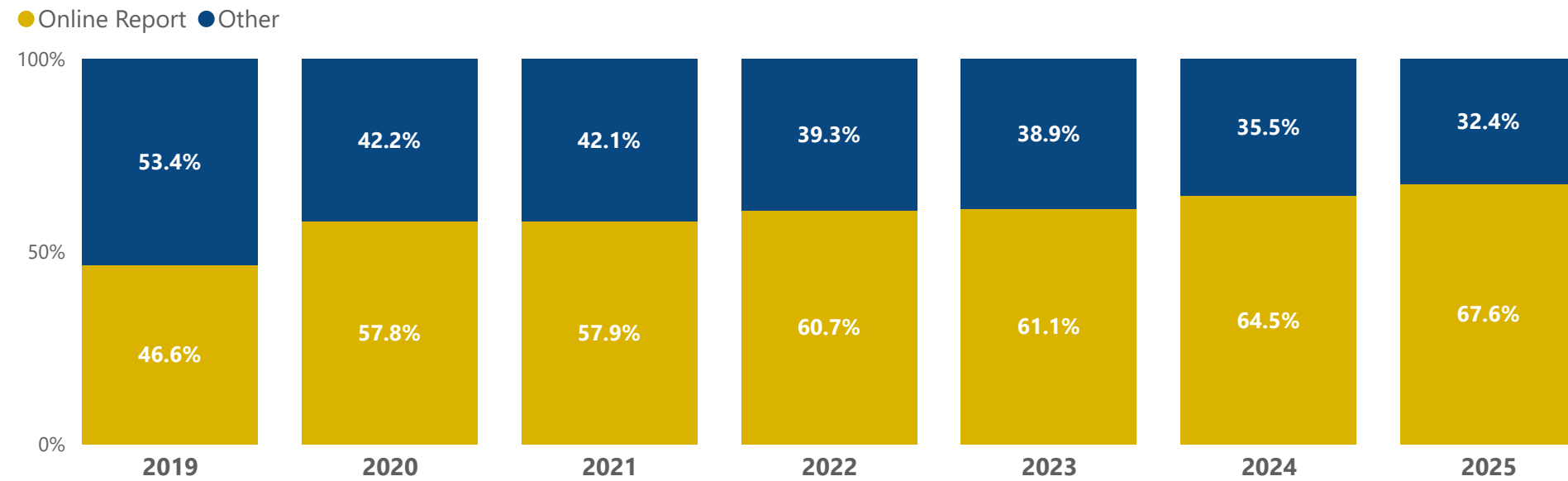
Property Crimes Reported Online: 2025



Total Crimes by Reporting Method: 2019 - 2025

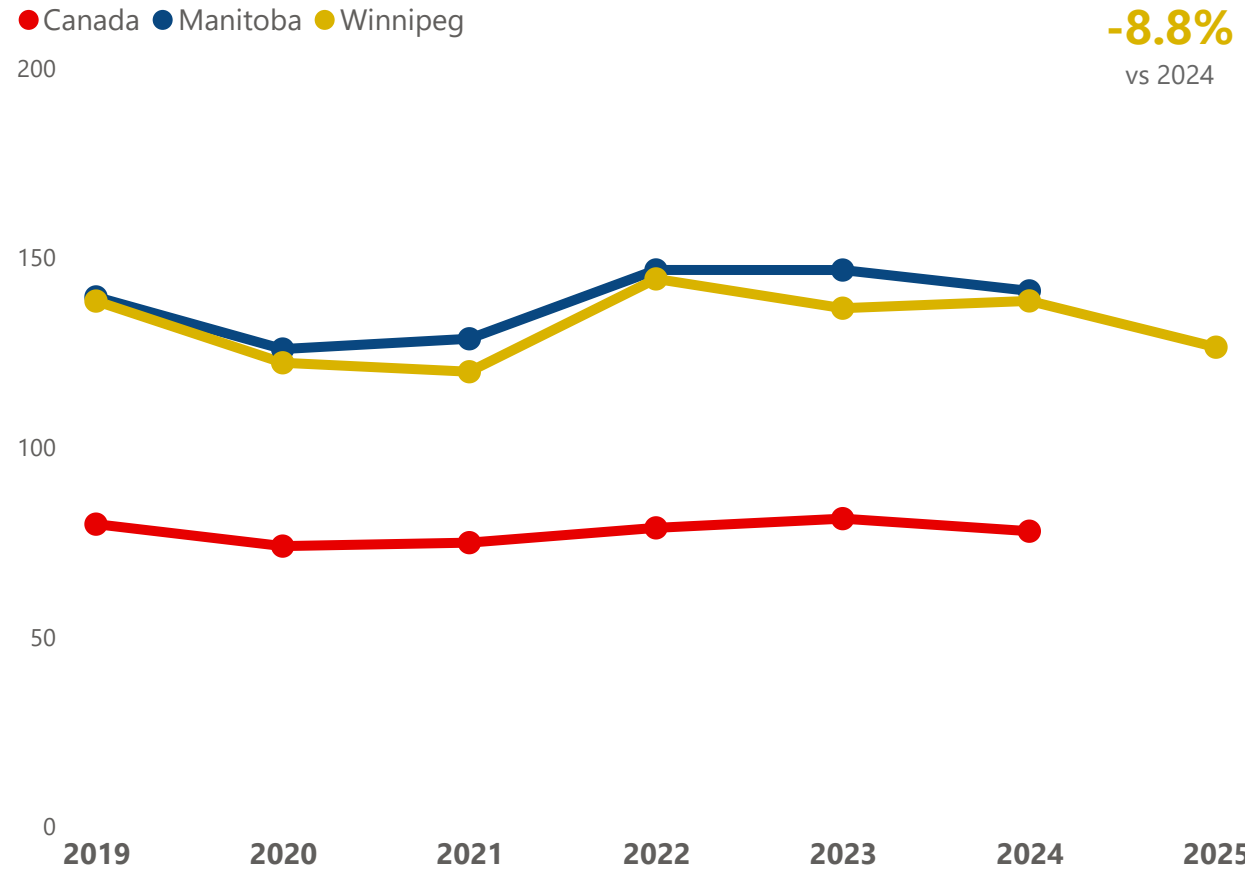

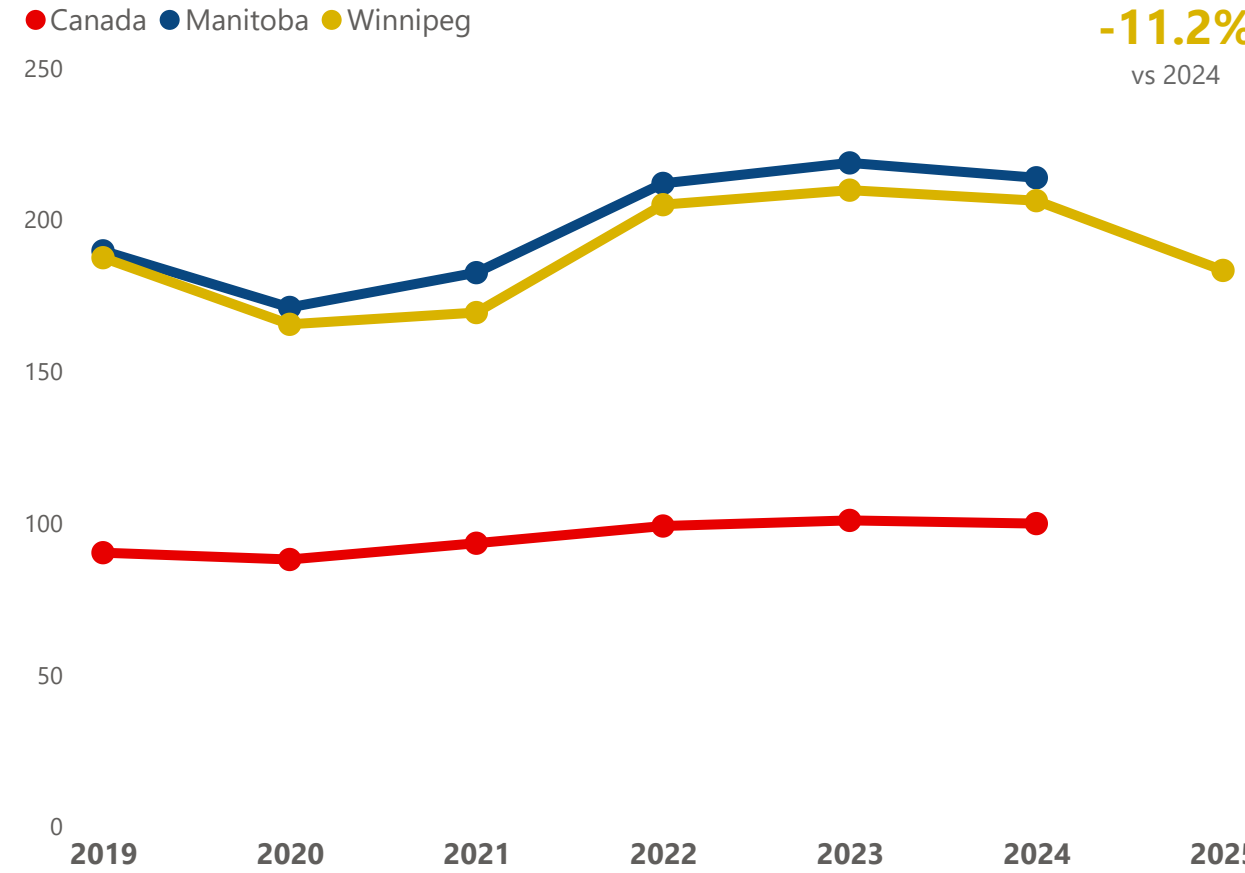




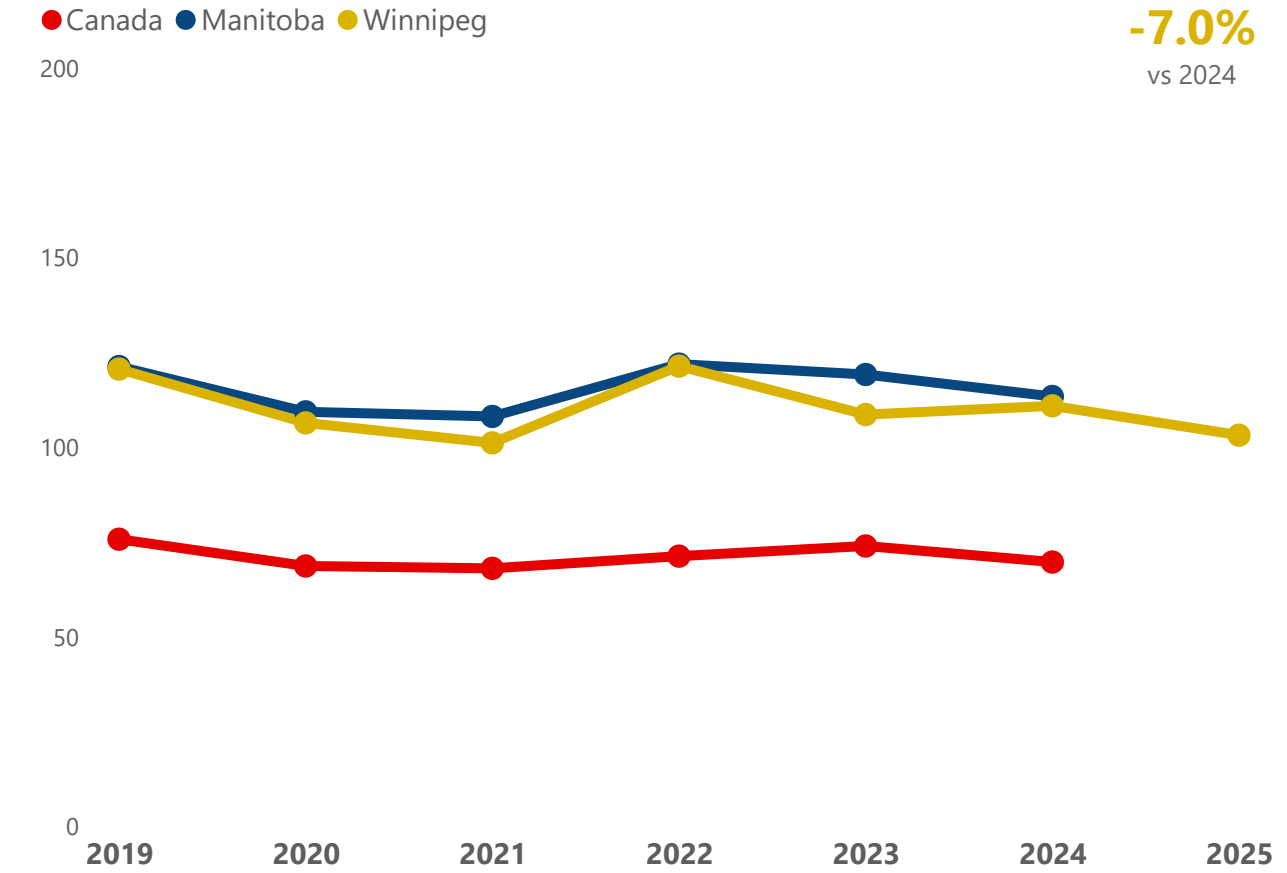
Total Crime Severity: 2019 - 2025



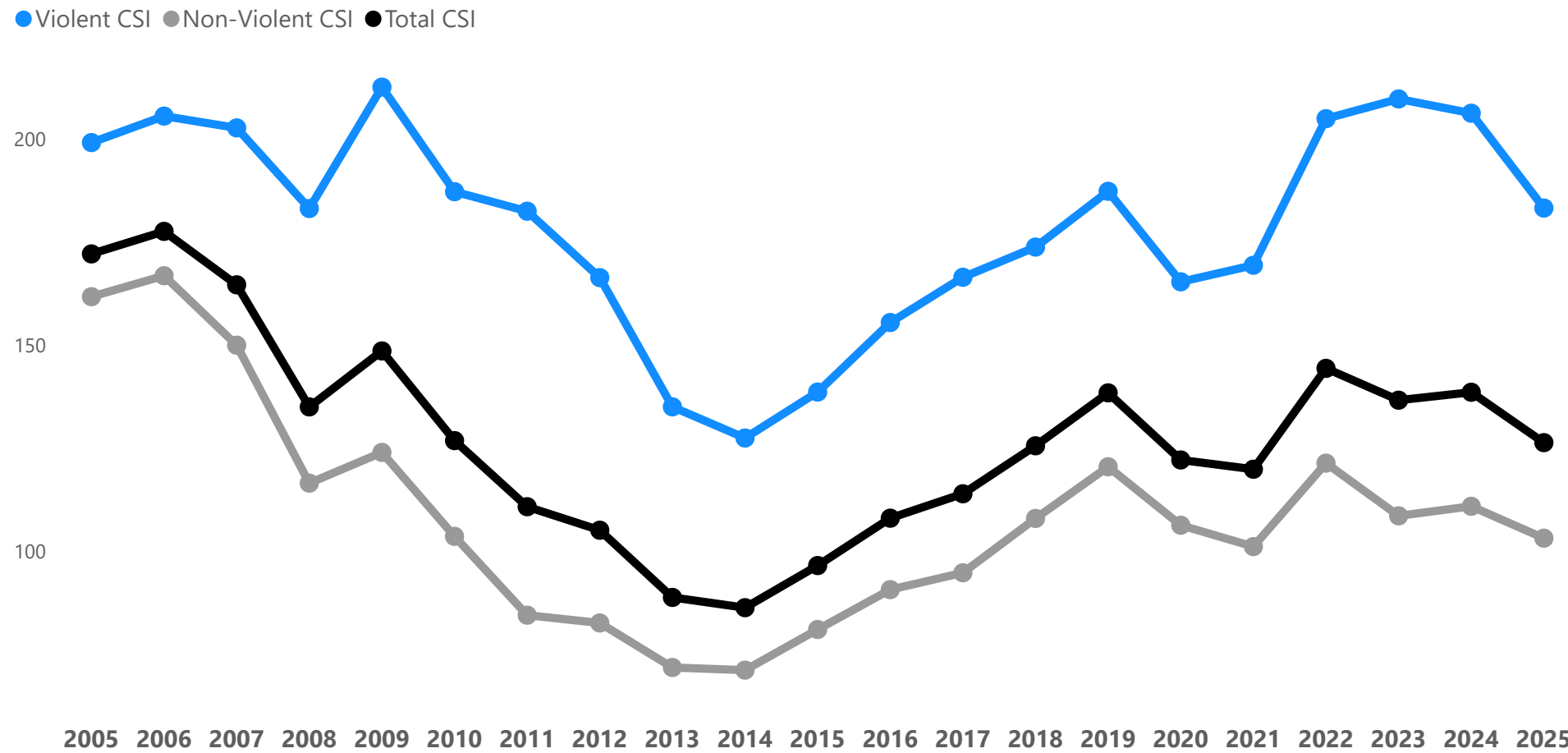
Violent Crime Severity: 2019 - 2025



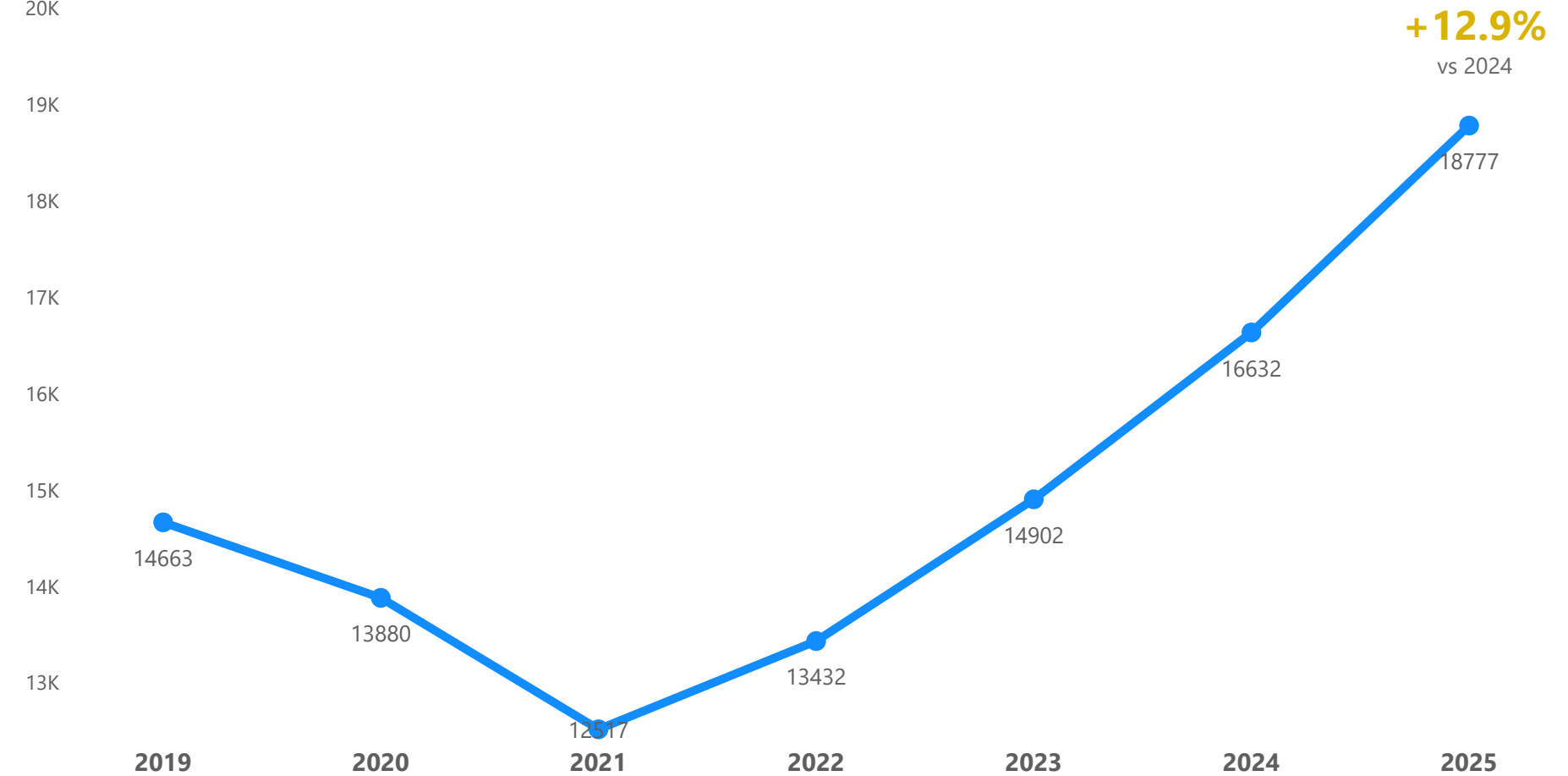
Non-Violent Crime Severity: 2019 - 2025



Winnipeg Crime Severity: 2005 - 2025

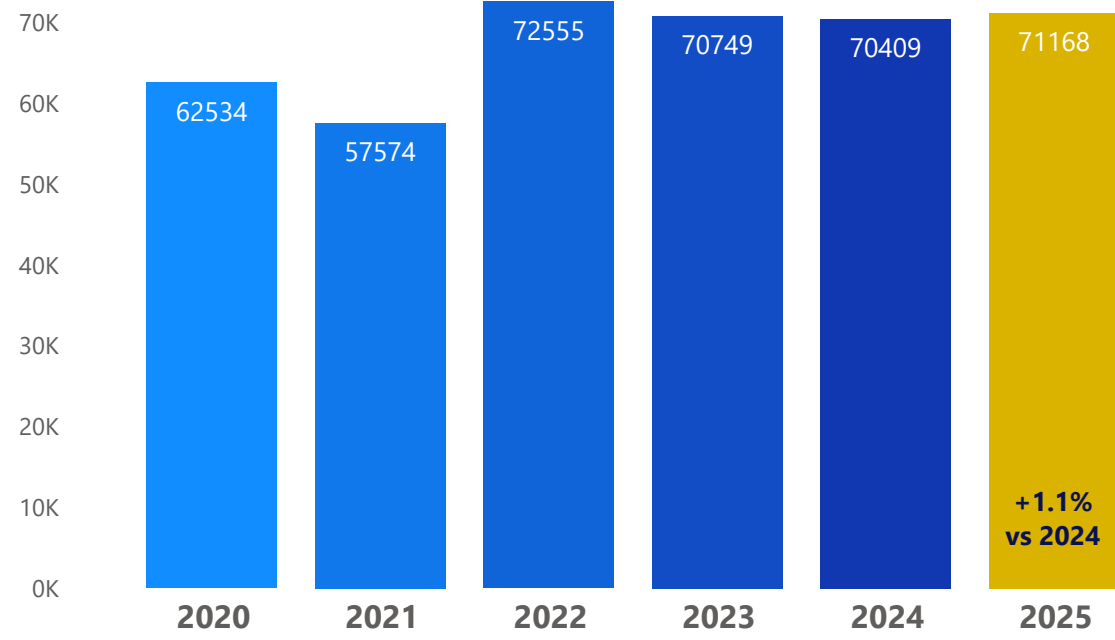

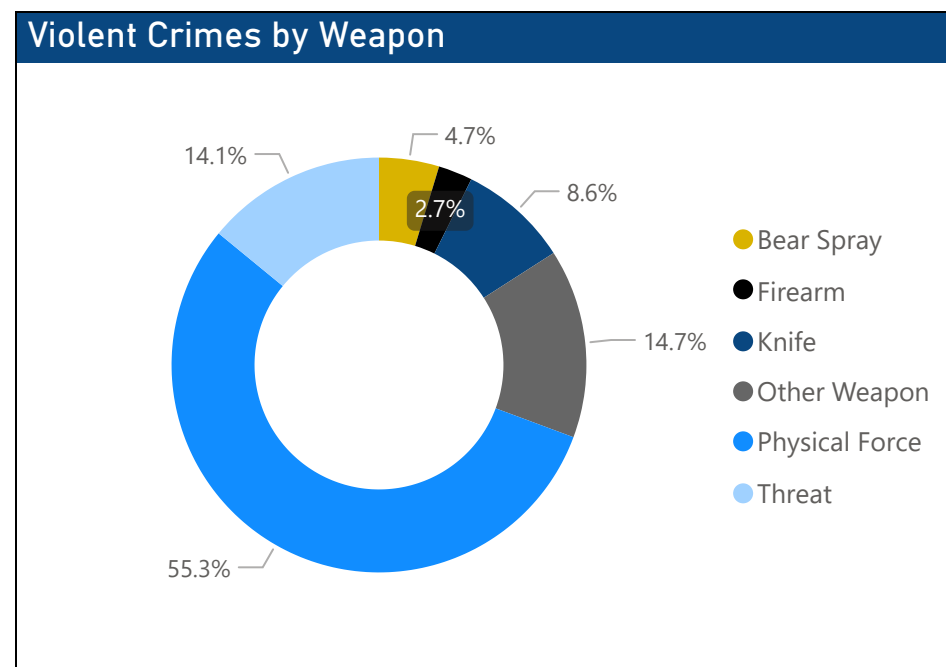
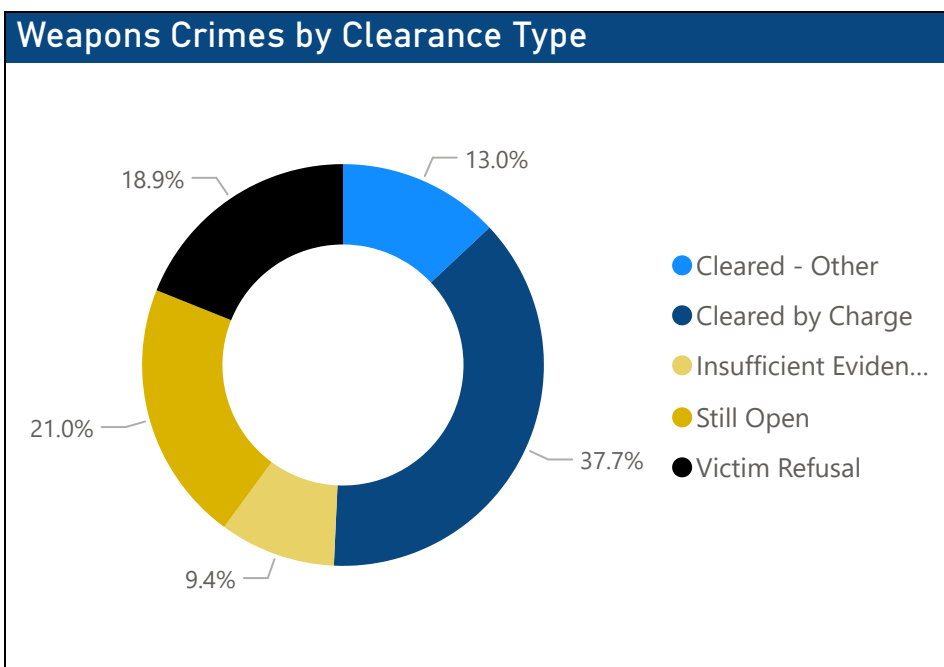
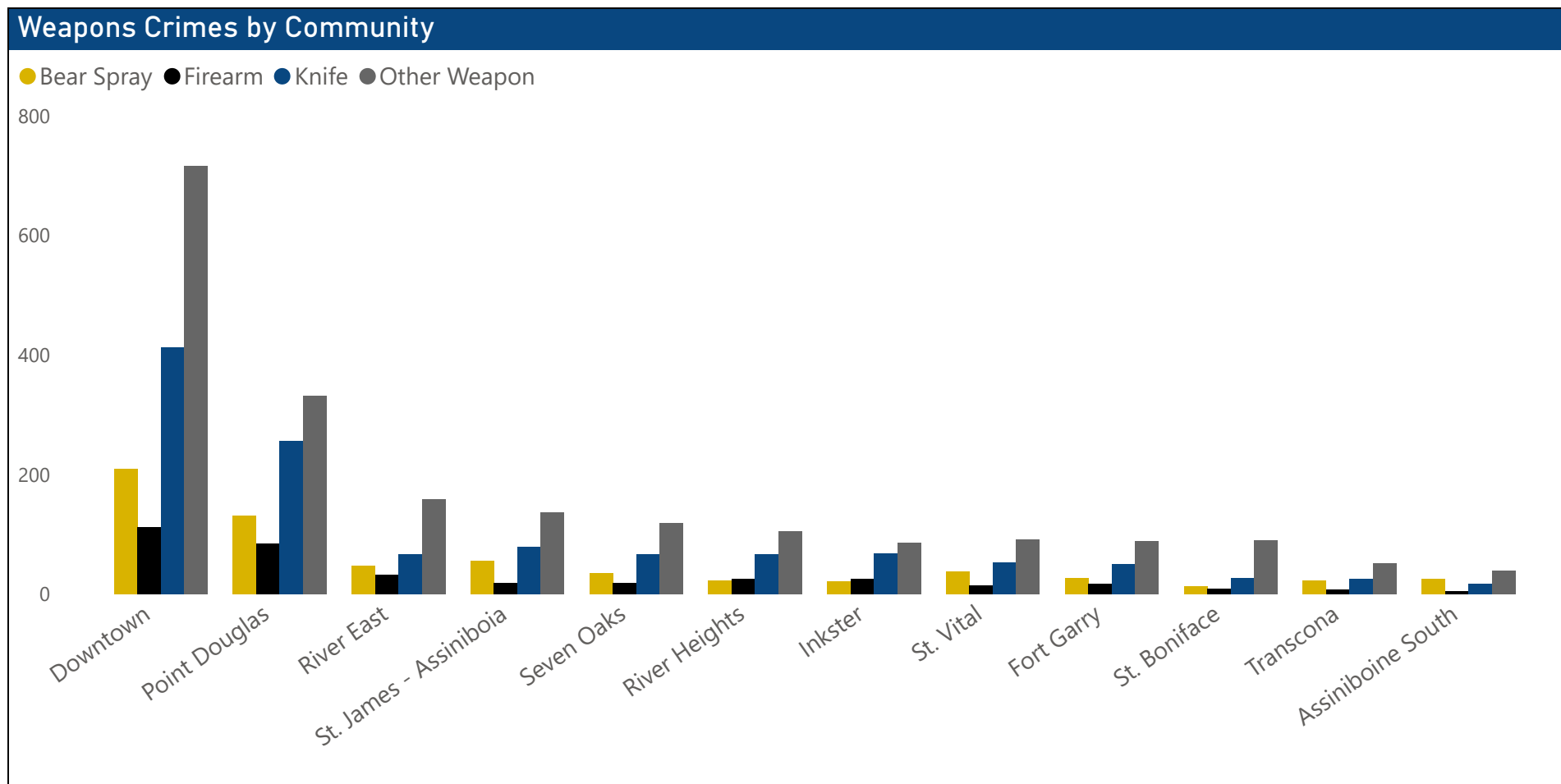
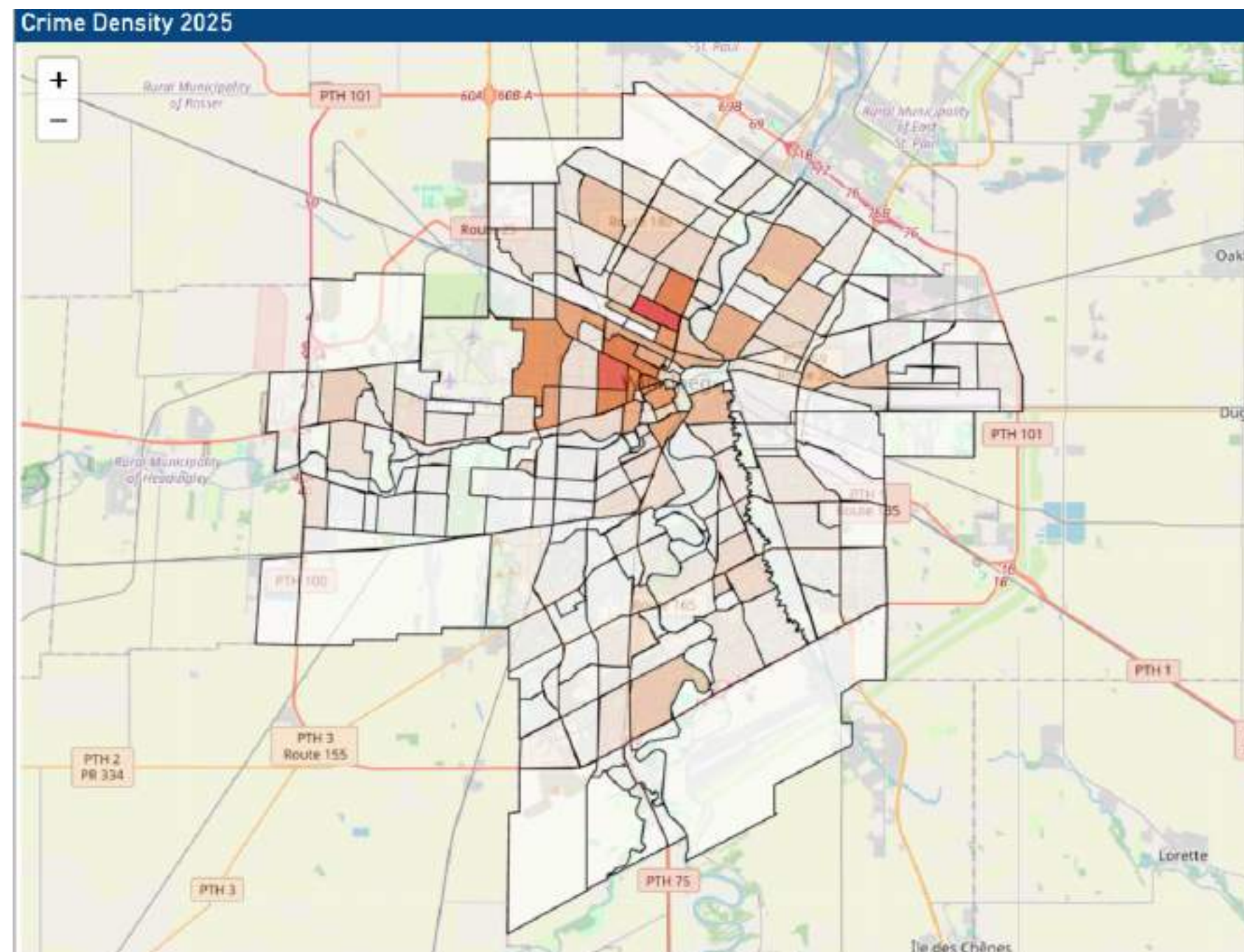
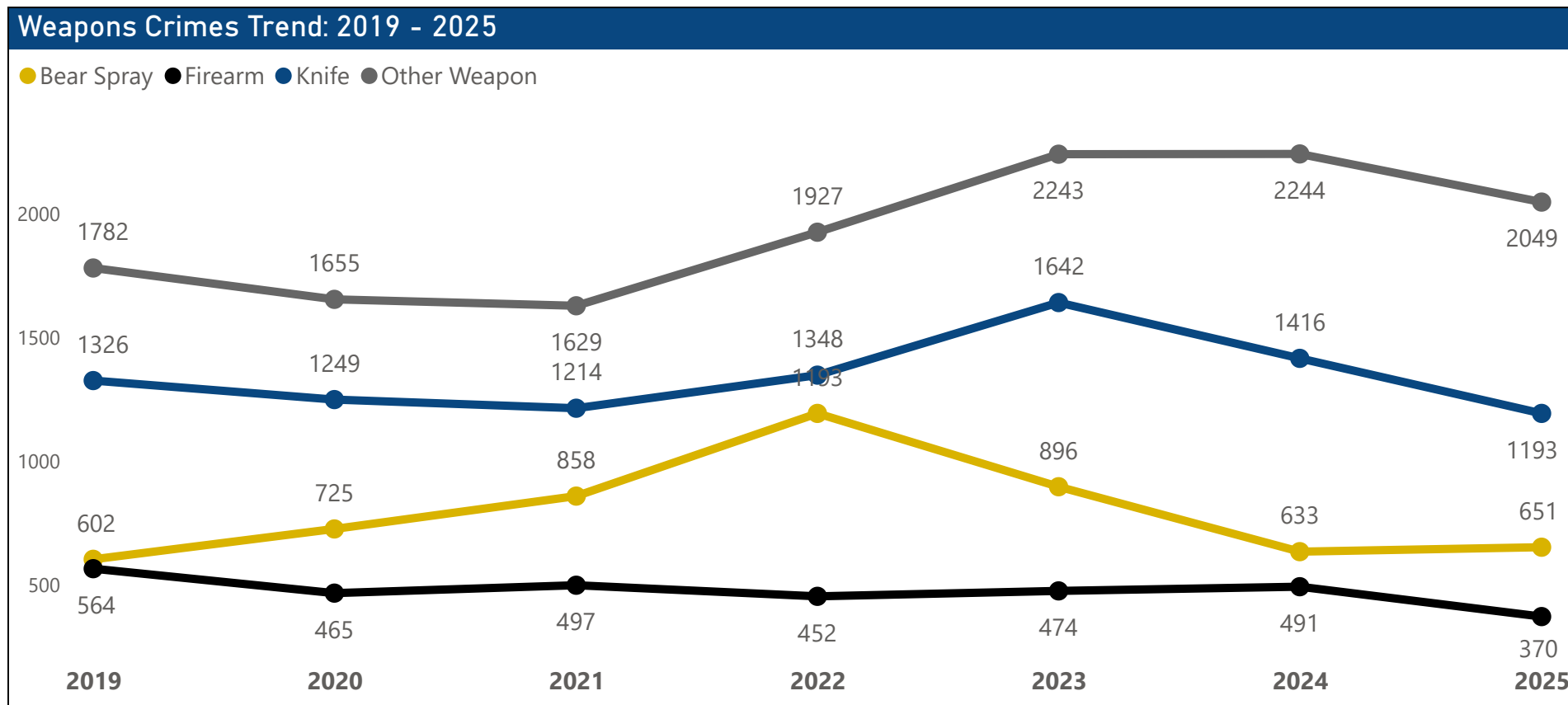
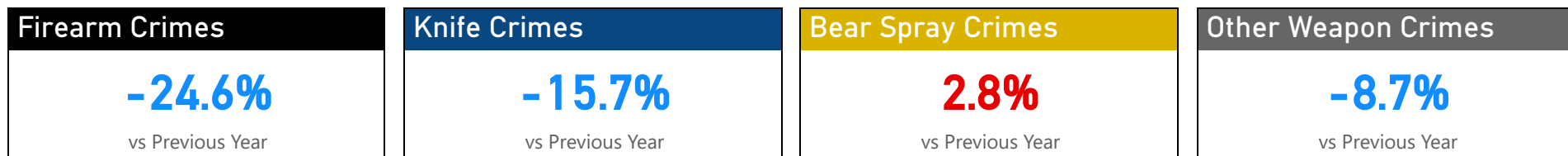


Violent Crimes by Relationship

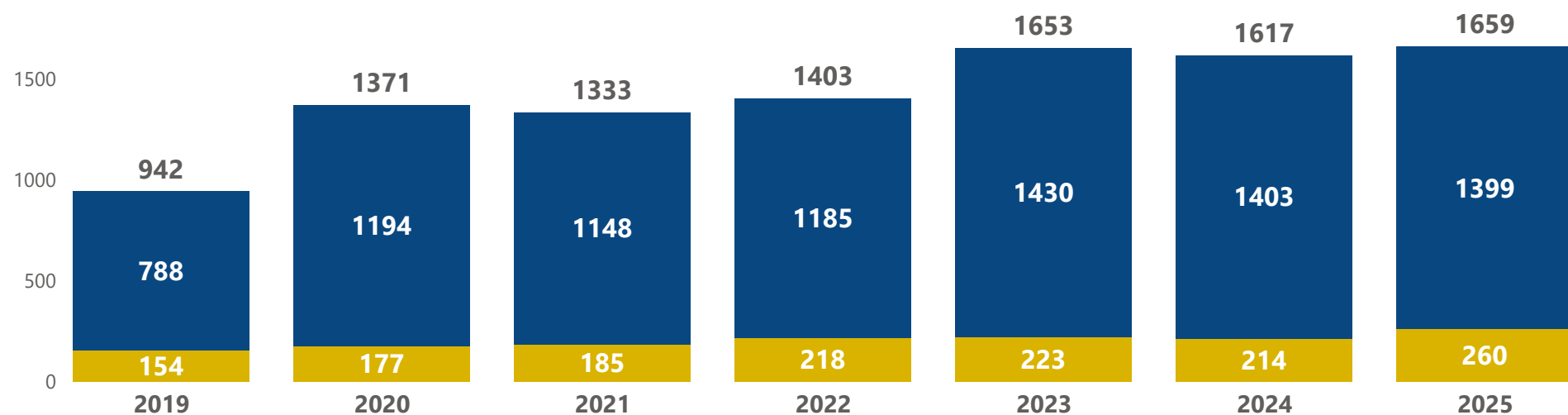




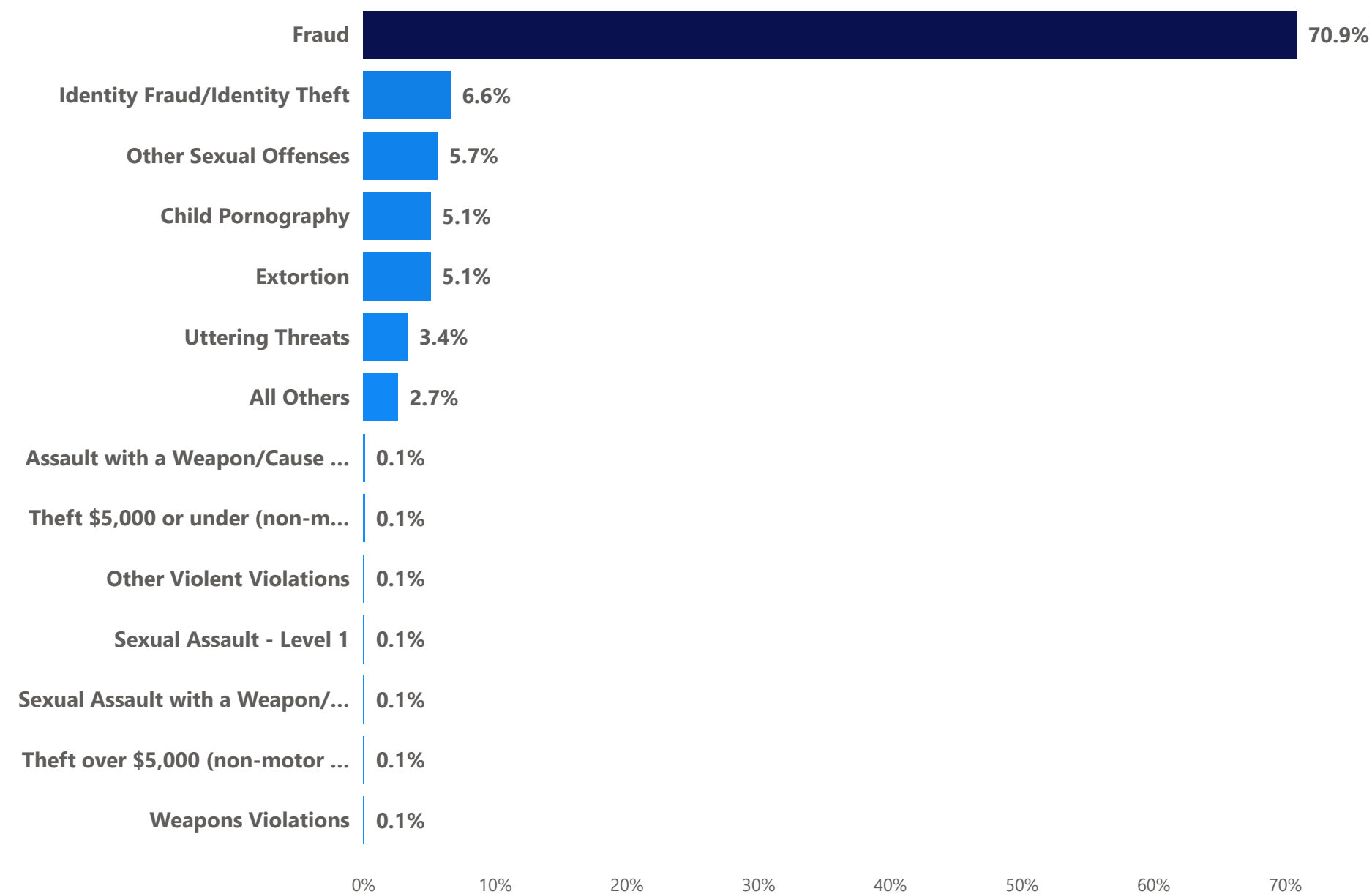


Cybercrime by Crime Type: 2019 - 2025

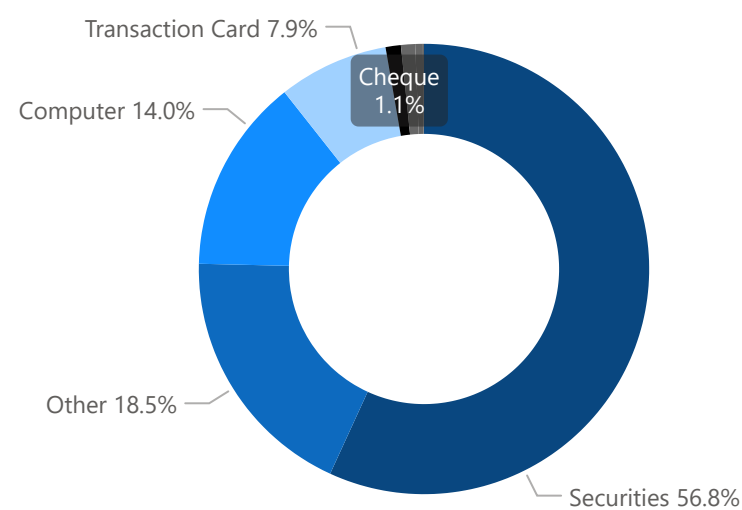

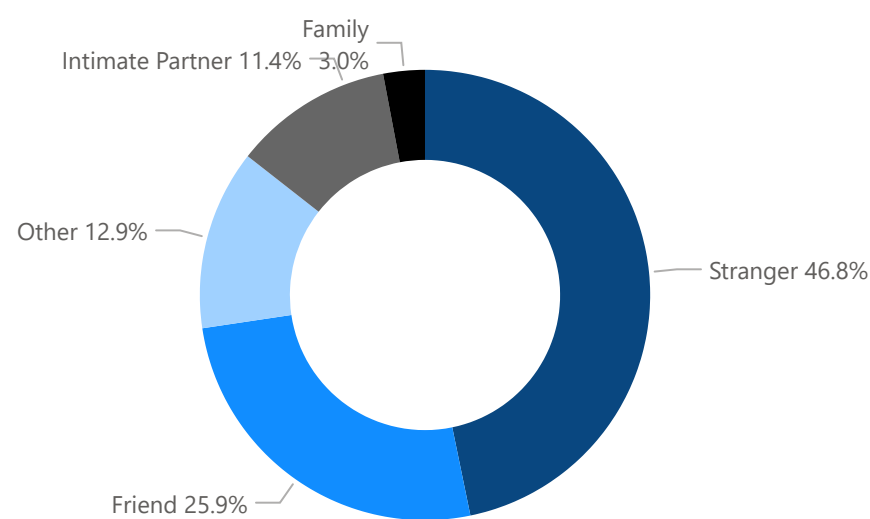
Cybercrime by Crime Category: 2025



Cyber Fraud by Type

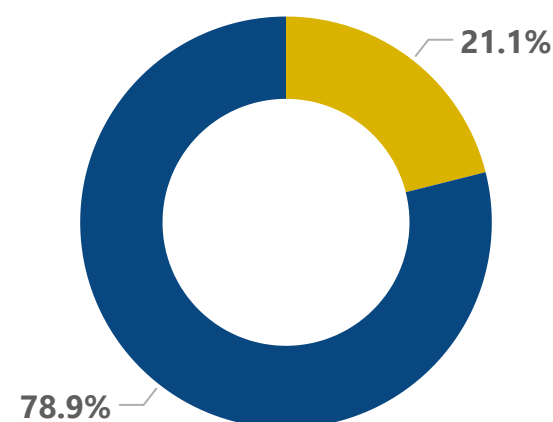

Violent Cybercrime by Victim Age: 2019 - 2025

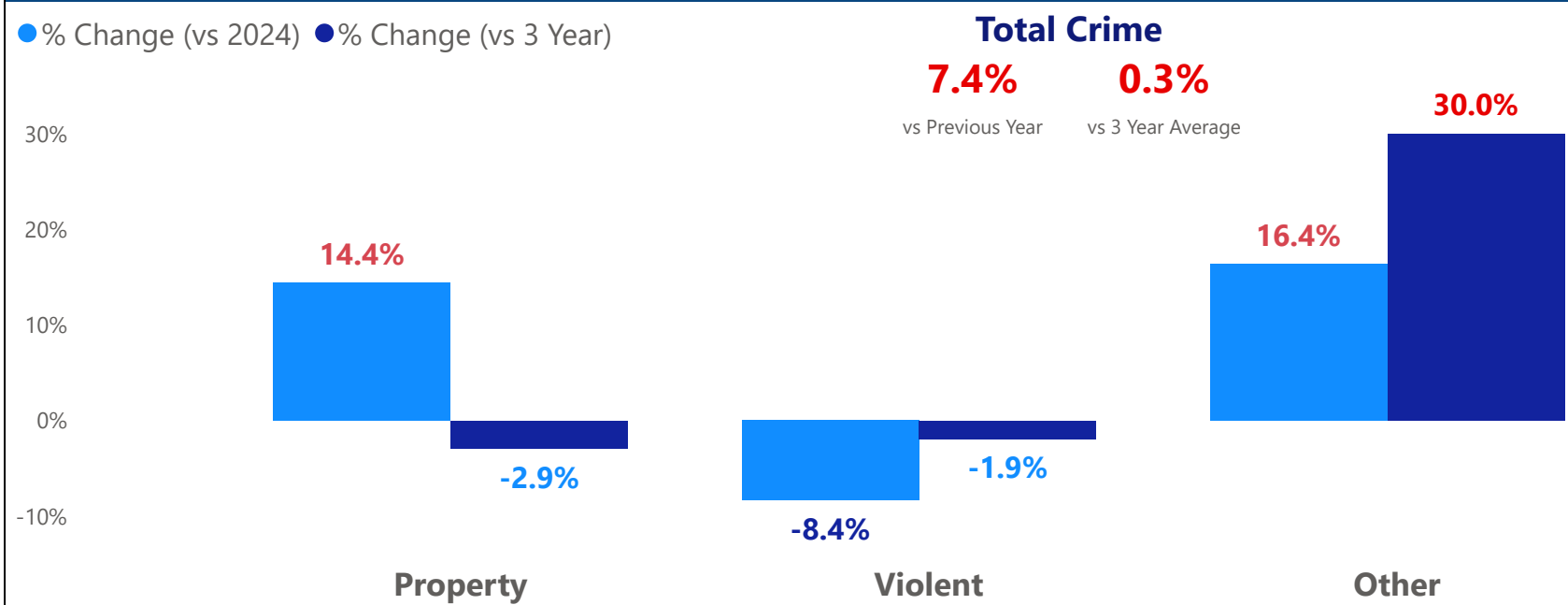




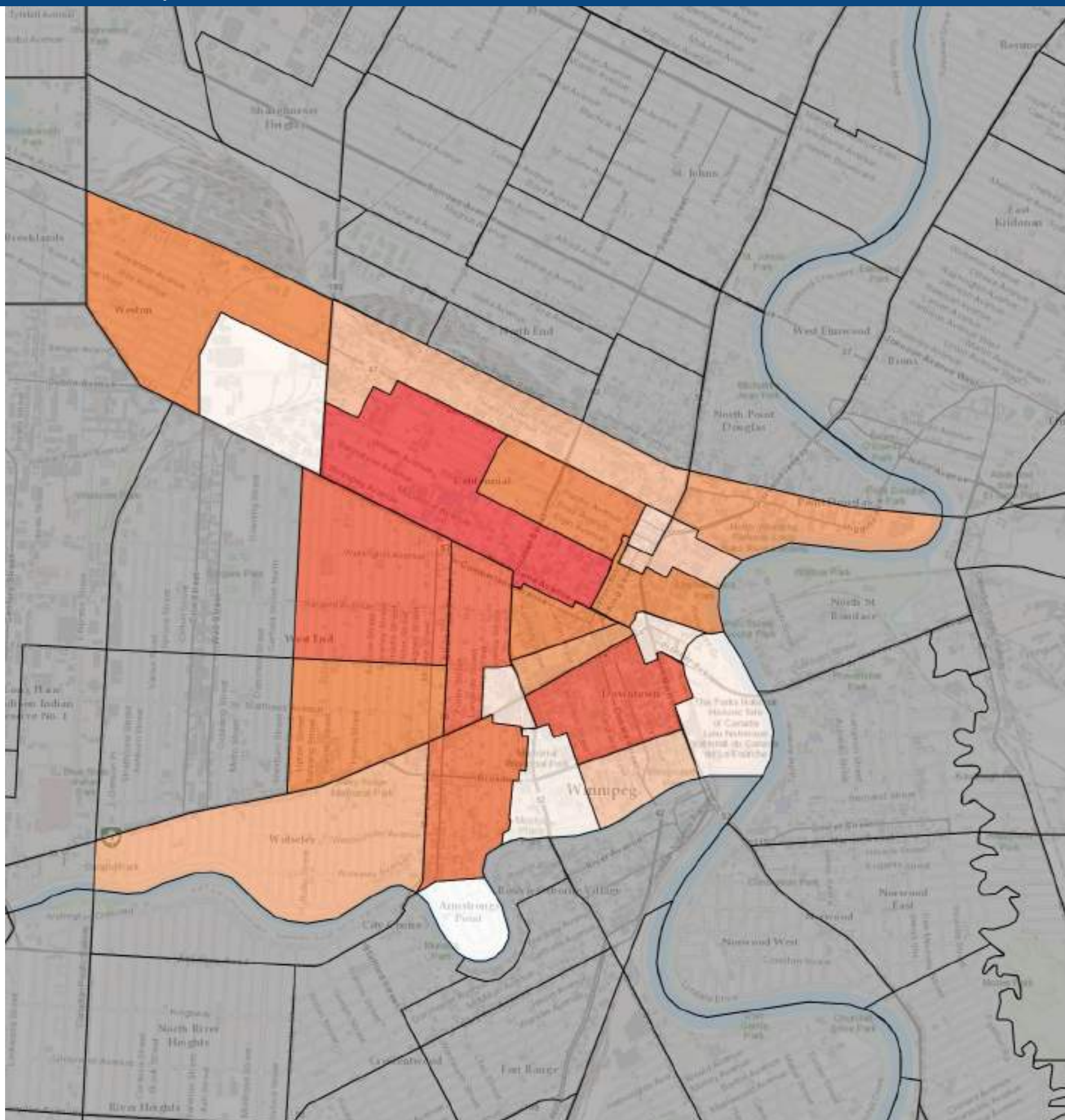


2025 Percent Change by Crime Category

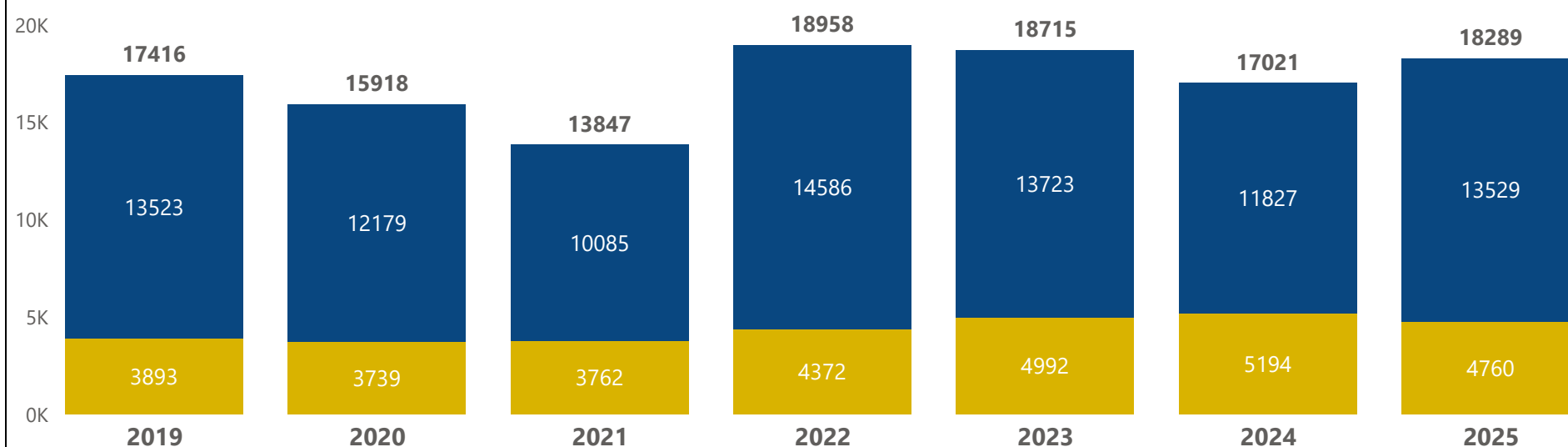


2025 Crime Density

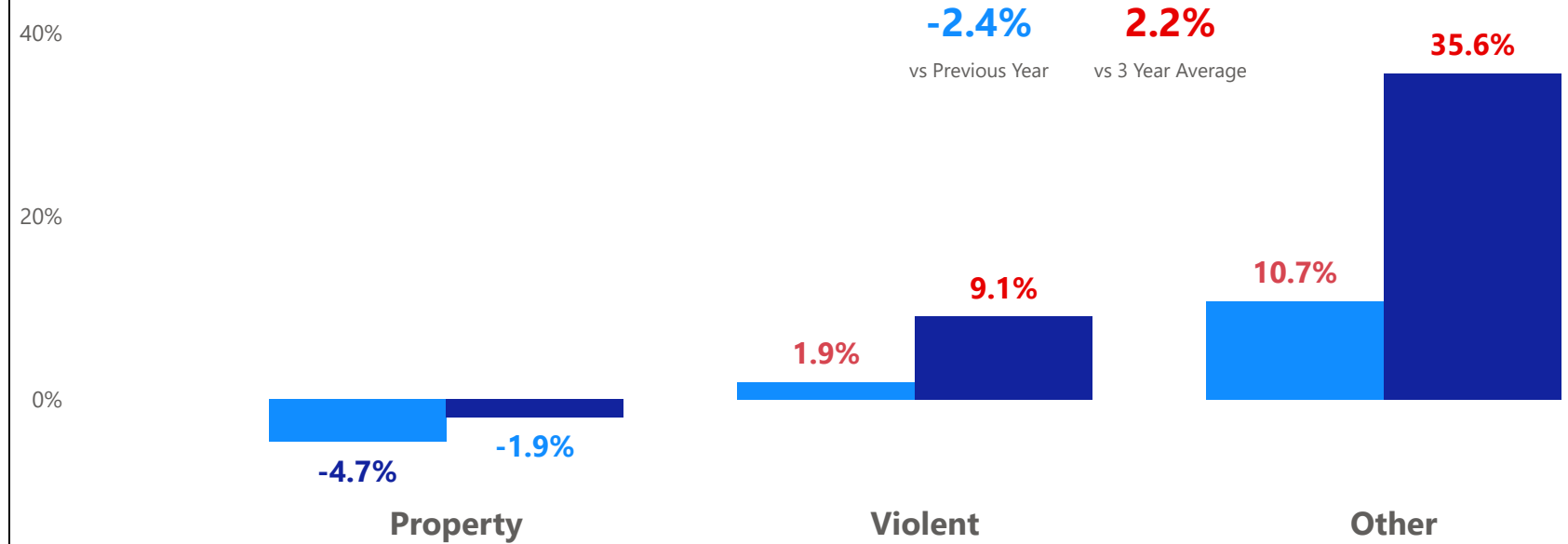

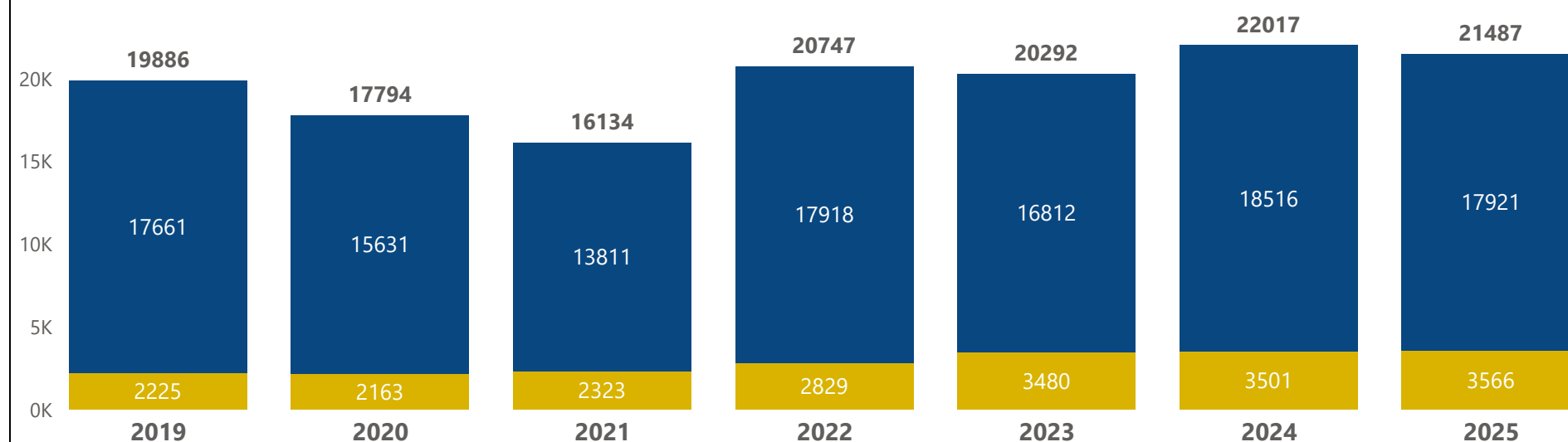
2025 Percent Change by Crime Category

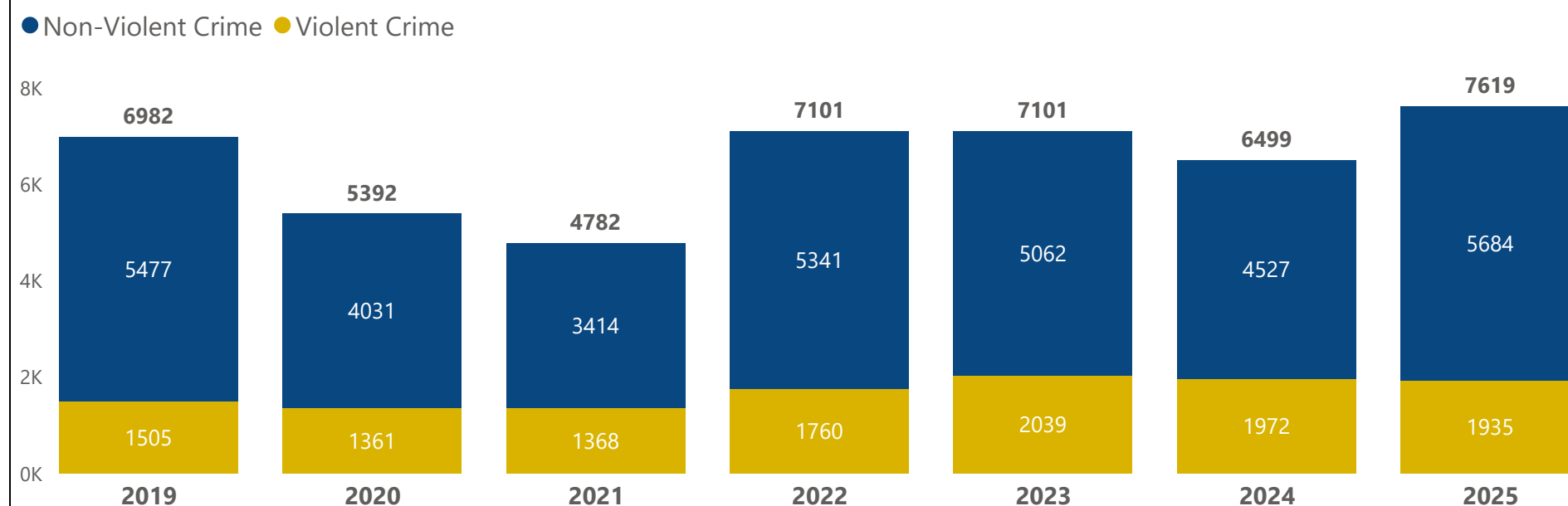

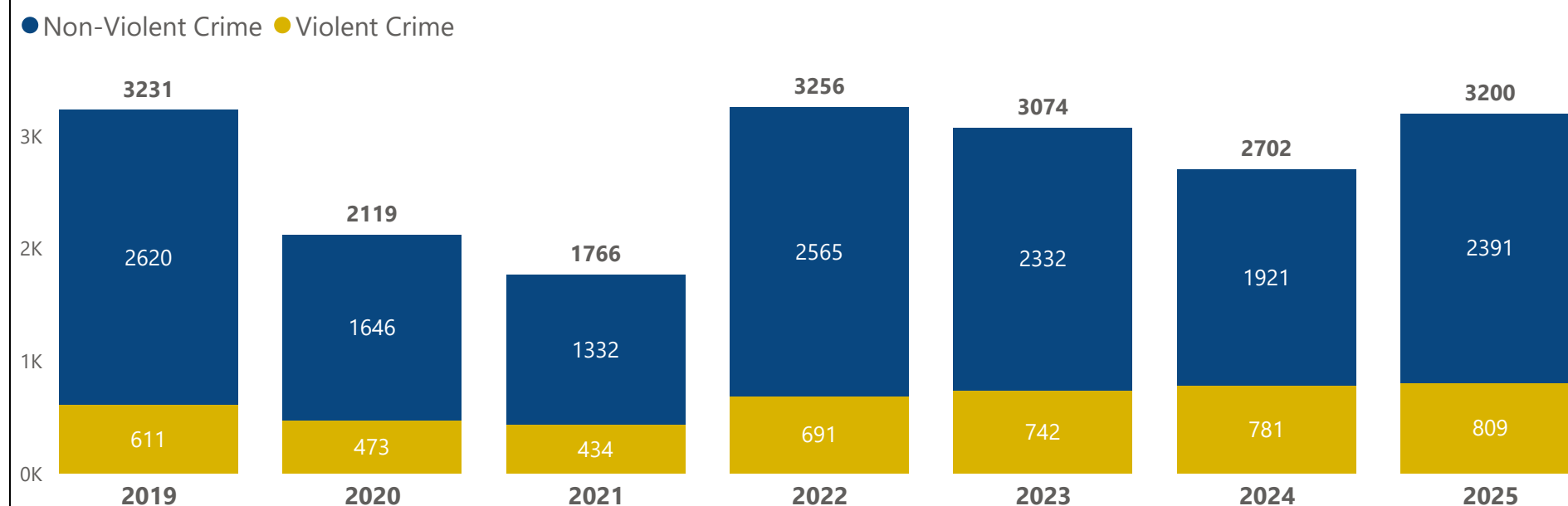

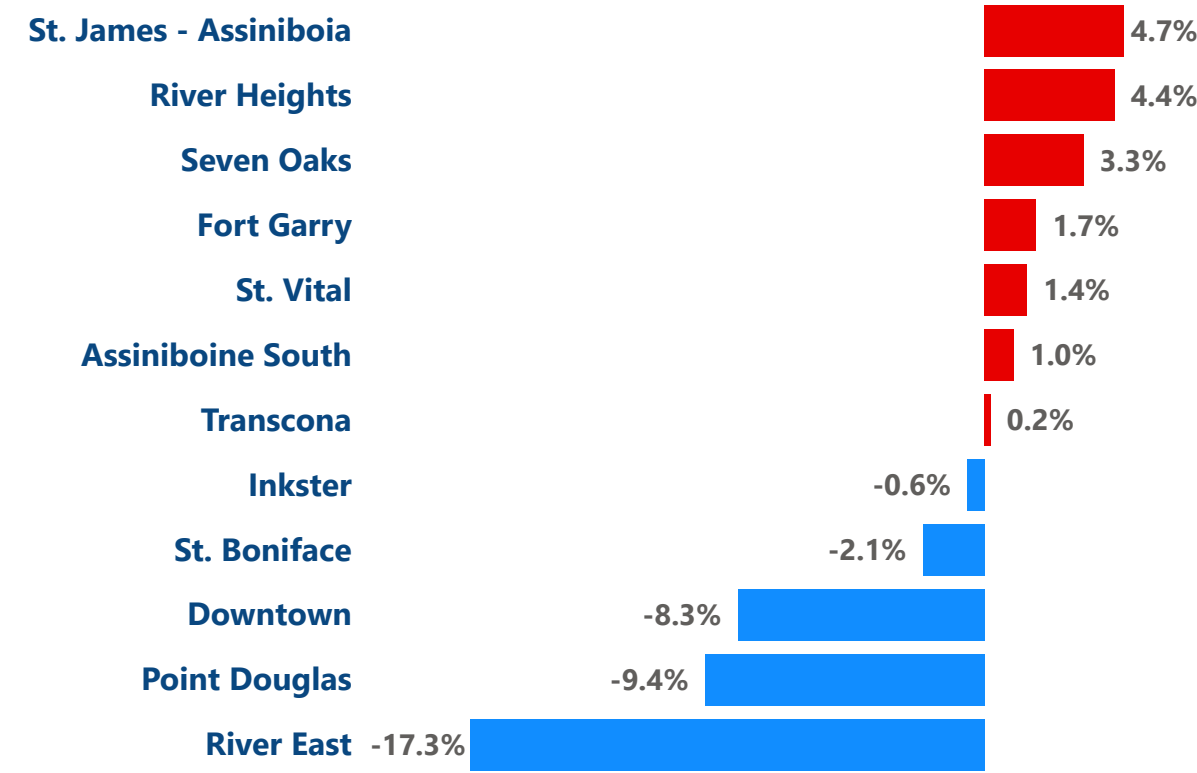




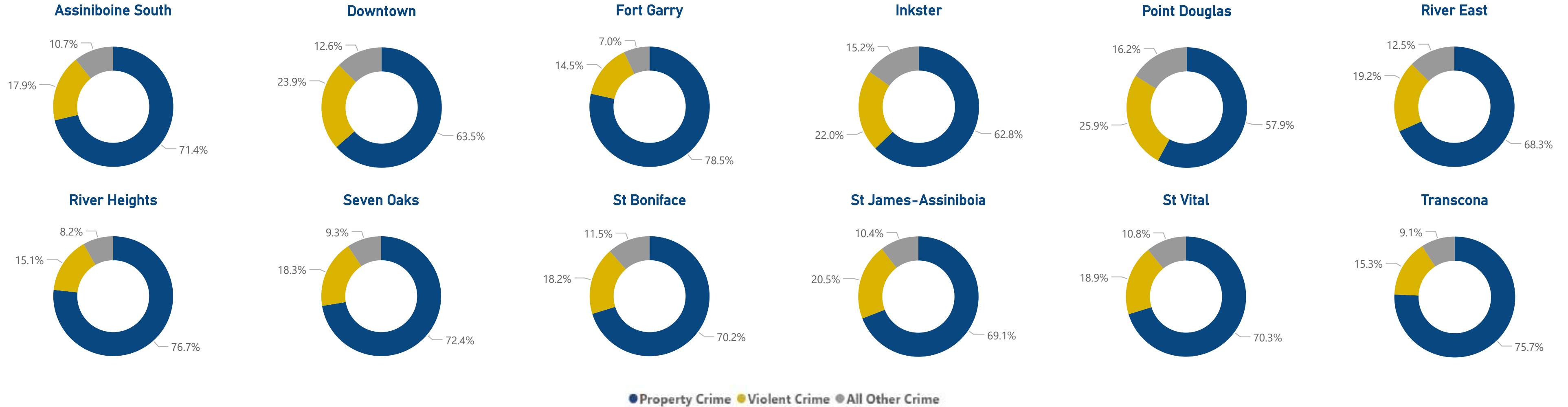
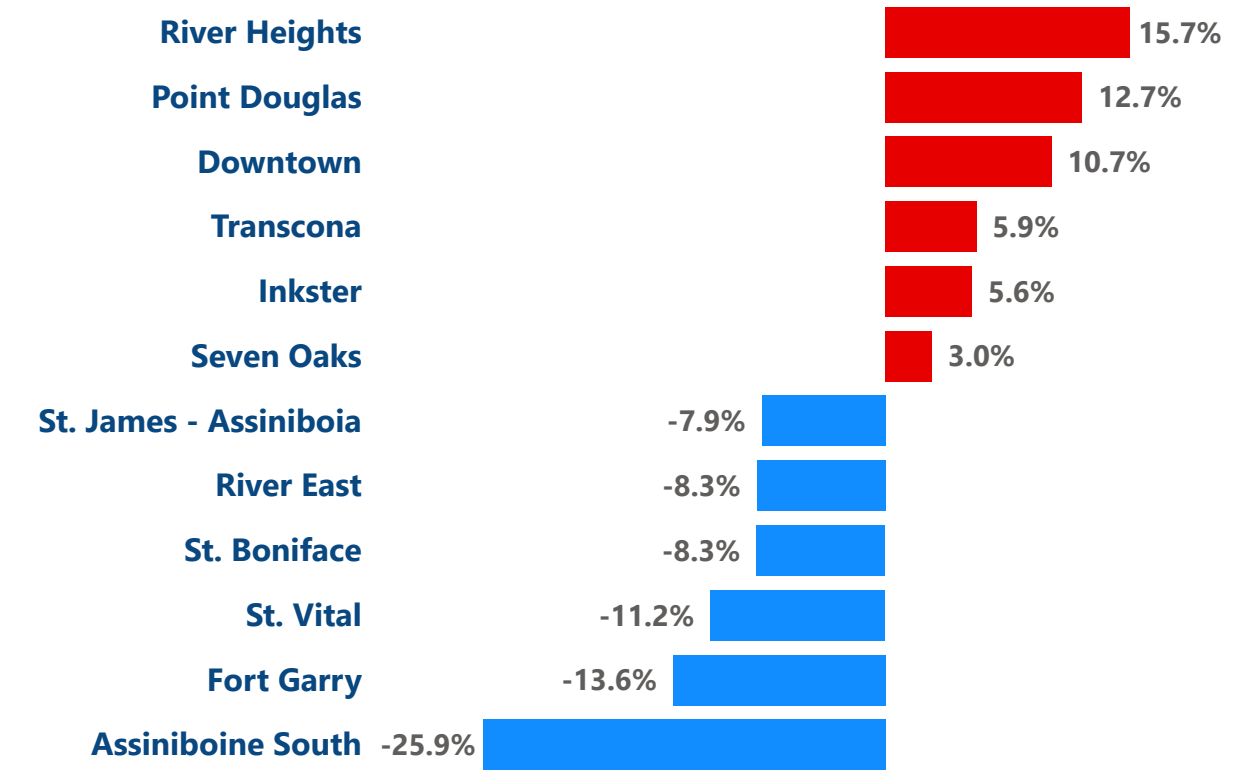
Total Crimes Percent Change vs Previous Year

Criminal Code Offence data are based on Uniform Crime Reporting data submitted to The Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS). Data were compiled in accordance with violent crimes (i.e. most serious violation against the victim), property crimes, and other crimes (i.e. first violation) scoring rules.

Population figures are based on the most recent Statistics Canada estimates by census sub-division using 2021 boundaries.

“Dispatched Events” refer to calls where a police unit was assigned. These events include both criminal and non-criminal events.

As a result of changes to the data collection process, some 'School Engagement' events—and by extension, certain 'Police-Initiated' events—are no longer classified as 'Dispatched Events.' This change may cause 2024 and 2025 figures for 'Police-Initiated Events' to appear lower in comparison to previous years.

“Non-District” include events that occurred over more than one district, events that occurred outside Winnipeg, and events where the location of occurrence is unknown.

“Downtown” lies within the Central District and the Portage Avenue Zones lie within Downtown. The Portage Avenue Zone includes the University Zone; the Retail Zone; the Sports, Hospitality and Entertainment Zone; and the Commercial Zone. Note that this definition of “Downtown” differs from the City of Winnipeg By-Law definition, which is referred to specifically in the “Activity by Community” section of this report.

Youth crime counts include youths aged 12-17 who were charged, arrested and not charged, or warned. The *Youth Criminal Justice Act* has an available option that diverts youths away from the court process through extrajudicial measures (such as formal diversionary programs). Youths subsequently breaching those conditions are charged under the YCJA. These charges appear under “Other Federal Statutes”.

Crime counts for Sexual Assault – Level 1, Other Sexual Offences, Assault – Level 1, Assaults against a Peace Officer, All Other Assaults, All Robberies, Kidnapping/Forcible Confinement, All Abductions, Extortion, Other Violent Crimes, Arson, Break & Enter, Motor Vehicle Thefts, Theft Over \$5000, Shoplifting Over \$5000, Theft Under \$5000, Shoplifting Under \$5000, Fraud, Identity Fraud/Theft, Mischief, Counterfeiting, Child Pornography, Administration of Justice Violations, “Other Criminal Code Violations”, and Trafficking / Production / Distribution include attempted and actual.

“All Sexual Assaults” includes “Sexual Assault” Levels 1, 2 and 3.

“All Assaults” includes “Assault” Levels 1, 2 and 3, as well as ‘All Other Assaults’ and “Assaults against Peace Officer”

“Attempted Murder” includes “Conspire to Commit Murder.”

“Arson” does not include “Arson - Disregard for Human Life”, which is categorized as a violent crime.

“Cannabis-related Criminal Charges” only includes events post-legalization of Crime Code Cannabis offences.

“Other Sexual Offenses” includes “Sexual Offences against Children.”

“Kidnapping/Forcible Confinement” includes “Trafficking in Persons.”

“Possess Stolen Property” includes Alter/Destroy/Remove VIN and “Trafficking Stolen Goods.”

“Bear Spray” is defined as 'burning liquid/caustic agent' in the Uniform Crime Reporting Survey. Includes substances such as acid, hot oil, pepper spray and mace.

The WPS uses the definition provided by Statistics Canada to determine hate crimes. The actual number of hate-related incidents may be higher than what is reported here inasmuch as the incidents would not be cited as an actual "hate crime" if those incidents do not meet all the criteria.

Caution should be used when interpreting low numbers, as small numerical changes can result in large percent changes.

The actual counts, rates, percent changes, and clearance rates data for City of Winnipeg crime totals include calculations submitted to the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS). Due to CCJCSS updates, previously reported numbers are subject to change. Because the data printed in previous Winnipeg Police Service Annual Statistical Reports do not contain the updates, actual crime figures may vary slightly with CCJCSS historical data.

Criminal Code Offence and Calls for Service data from 2019 - 2024 as referenced in this report have been restated for those years.

Statistical data are accurate as at date of publication. Unless otherwise specified, all data contained within this report were compiled and produced by the WPS Business Intelligence Unit.
